

The Board was briefed on the problems the staff periodically has with a transcript evaluation being provided by the Board-appointed transcript evaluation services. Occasionally, there are conflicts between the services on the same transcript. Also, due to political climates of some countries, some applicants cannot have the foreign institution send an original transcript to the evaluation service. The Board decided that they would review an evaluation from another source other than an original transcript, on a case-by-case basis.

The Board reviewed a request if it would allow continuing education credit for instructors or participants in a university freshman engineering Chamber Project. Based on the criteria for continuing education as outlined in the Administrative Code, it was the Board's opinion that the project appears to be eligible for continuing education credit.

The Board reviewed correspondence in regards to the ADEM Underground Storage Tank Remediation program. It was the Board's decision to monitor the situation, since it appears to be an issue between the General Contractor's Board and ADEM.

The Board reviewed correspondence from a legislator in reference to the use of the title "Marine Surveyor" by individuals who do not perform land surveying. The Board concurred that it would appear that under Section 34-11-2(c) that the title "land surveyor" is a protected title, and not simply "surveyor". As such, individuals may use the title "Marine Surveyor" without being a licensed professional land surveyor, since they do not practice land surveying. An official opinion of the Board will be issued that reflects this guidance.
