



Governor Riley Appoints New Board Members

Governor Bob Riley recently appointed Dr. Daniel S. Turner, PE and Mr. Phillip E. Santora, PE/PLS to fill the 2 newly authorized positions on the State Board. The Board now consists of 7 members. The August 1, 2009 amendment to the Code of Alabama 1975 provided for the addition of one Professional Engineer and one Professional Land Surveyor to the existing Board. Both appointments are effective until July 31, 2014.

Dr. Turner currently serves as Professor in the Civil, Construction & Environmental Engineering Department for the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, AL. He brings a rich engineering experience to the Board. Dr. Turner received his BSCE (1969) and MSCE (1970) from the University of Alabama; and his Ph.D.(1980) from Texas A&M. He has authored or co-authored 305 publications (books, journal articles, tech reports, etc); and 545 presentations at technical and professional meetings.

Dr. Turner is married to the former Linda Green and they have four sons; four daughters-in-law; and nine grandchildren.

Mr. Santora currently serves as President of Northstar Engineering Services Inc located in Dothan, Alabama. He also brings to the Board many years of experience in the land surveying & engineering fields. Mr. Santora received his BSCE (1993) from the University of South Alabama. He has over 16 years of experience in design and project management in the field of civil engineering and 12 years of experience in surveying.

His surveying and design experience includes street developments, water and sanitary sewer systems, storm water management facilities, and grading, draining, and utility plans for numerous municipal improvement projects, commercial site developments, and residential developments.

RENEWAL TIME IS HERE!



Once again, it is renewal time for individual licenses and corporate certificates of authorization. Included in this issue of *The Board's Bulletin* you will find helpful hints and instructions to help your renewal experience be as painless and efficient as possible.

The Board has worked to simplify the renewal process for all our licensees. As in previous years, you may use our "online renewal system" to renew your individual license or corporate certificate. There is no additional fee for using this service.

Continuing Education Log ... Earlier this year we were excited to offer another service we believe will be of great benefit to those who choose to use it. In April, the Board (working with Alabama Interactive) developed a system whereby you can enter continuing education activities once completed to your personal record using the Continuing Education Activity Log found on our website. This system allows you to store records of your Professional Development Hours (PDH) in a convenient location. But that's not the only benefit. Those who opted to use this system throughout the year will find it will help simplify your online renewal. Now, instead of re-entering all your PDH information online, you will find your activity is already listed. If the information listed is correct and you have at least 15 PDH credits shown, you will now simply hit the "continue" button.

Renewal Notifications ... Each year the Board sends out thousands of individual and corporate renewal notices. In accordance with the Code of Alabama 1975, Title 34, Chapter 11 § 34-11-8(a), the Board sends these notices "to the last address of the licensee recorded by the executive director of the board at least one month in advance of the renewal deadline." Each renewal period we discover that licensees did not receive their renewal notices because we had not been made aware of an address change. Each licensee is strongly encouraged to report any address change to the Board by clicking the "Change of Address" link found in the "Forms & Status" section of our website. This applies to both individual and corporate addresses.

Licensee Responsibility ... While the Board makes every effort to notify individuals and companies of their upcoming renewal deadline, it remains the licensees' responsibility to insure their individual license or company certificate is renewed on time. There is a significant reinstatement fee for those individuals and companies who do not renew on time. The renewal deadlines are the same annually: December 31st: PE/PLS/EI/LSI Licensees; and January 31st for Company Certificates of Authorization. These are dates you may want to put in your Outlook Express; Day Timer or other suspense file.

No Waivers for Reinstatement Fees ... At its March 5, 2009 meeting, the Board considered the requests of 40 individuals and/or companies to have the "Reinstatement Fee" waived. Each of these individuals and companies had failed to renew prior to the required deadline. After review, the Board determined there is no provision in the Administrative Code that would allow such waivers. The best way to insure that you do not have to pay the reinstatement fee is to renew the appropriate license or certificate on time.

Why Are Paper Renewals Returned for Correction?

PE/PLS LICENSE RENEWALS

1. Failure to complete Part II on the form's front page. Each question must be answered either "yes" or "no".
2. Failure to sign or list SSN in section III. (SSN is required by Code of Alabama, 1975 § 30-3-194)
3. Inadequate number of PDH credits listed on the back of the form. You must have a total of 15 PDH to renew your license. You may include in this total up to 15 hours carried over from the previous renewal.
4. Failure to complete an Alabama Standards of Practice Course every 4 years (Land Surveyors Only).
5. Failure to submit a check in the appropriate amount made payable to: PE & PLS FUND. (See the "Fee Schedule" on the front of the form for the correct amount).

CERTIFICATES OF AUTHORIZATION

1. Principal or Branch Responsible PE or PLS has not yet renewed his/her individual license for 2010.
2. Failure to list the physical address(es) of all office(s) offering engineering/land surveying services in section 2.
3. Failure to list responsible charge(s) for the office(s) listed in section 2.
4. Failure to list officers and board of directors in section 3 or partners in section 4.
5. Failure to complete the certifying statement in section 5. The complete SSN must be submitted.
6. Failure to bear the signature of the company's designating authority in section 6. This section must be completed by an officer/director or partner shown in section 3 or 4 only if the responsible charge in section 5 is not an officer/director or partner of the firm.
7. Failure to submit a check in the appropriate amount made payable to: PE & PLS FUND. (See the "Fee Schedule" on the front of the form for the correct amount)

Online Renewal Tips

PE/PLS LICENSE RENEWALS

1. If you have adequate PDH carryover hours from last year's renewal and you have no new PDH to enter for this renewal period simply hit "continue" when you arrive at the "Professional Development Hours (PDH) Information" page.
2. While processing your online renewal, you may not enter any Professional Development Hours that were completed prior to your last renewal (e.g., if you renewed last year on 10/15/08, the only PDH credit you can claim for this year's renewal is that completed from 10/16/08 to the date of your renewal and applicable carryover hours).
3. If your current license is in "lapsed" status you may not renew using the online renewal system. In these cases, the licensee must first submit a License Reinstatement Application to the Board. This application form can be found under "Forms & Status" on the Board's Home Page (www.bels.alabama.gov).

CERTIFICATES OF AUTHORIZATION

1. If your company has had a change in its principal engineer/land surveyor you must report this change to the Board using an Amended CA Application prior to renewing online.
2. A change in the company's physical or mailing address must be reported to the Board prior to renewing online. This notification can be made using the Amended CA Application, or by an e-mail from the principal PE/PLS or officer of the company.

3. Remember to list all officers & directors online or e-mail a list of the officers/directors to the e-mail address shown above.
4. All principal or branch responsible PE's/PLS's must have renewed their individual licenses prior to renewing the company's COA online.

NCEES Votes to Contribute to the National Museum of Surveying

The August 2009 edition of *Licensure Exchange*, published by NCEES reports that NCEES voted to approve a \$75,000 contribution to the National Museum of Surveying located in Springfield, Illinois. This contribution will help in the construction of a 45-seat theater and the development of educational materials for students in grades K-12.

NCEES Revising Structural Exam

NCEES will introduce a new 16-hour Structural PE exam in April 2011. The exam will replace the current Structural I and Structural II exams, which will be administered for the last time in October 2010.

This change is based on action at the 2007 Annual Meeting, when the Council passed the following motion from the Structural Exam Task Force: “Move that the Committee on Examinations for Professional Engineers (EPE) be charged with modernizing the format of the SE I and SE II examinations to become a single structural engineering examination with two 8-hour components that will be put into use by April 2011.”

NCEES Director of Exam Services Tim Miller, P.E., explained the need for the revision: “NCEES currently offers two 8-hour structural exams, and some licensing boards also use state-specific exams. NCEES wanted to provide one exam that could be used by any state requiring specialized structural licensure, even a state with high-seismic activity.”

To develop the new exam, NCEES surveyed licensed structural engineers from across the United States to find out what knowledge areas are most relevant to current professional practice. NCEES brought together representatives from state licensing boards and national structural engineering organizations to analyze the survey results and set the specifications, or content areas, for the new examination. “We’ve gone through a deliberate and rigorous process to develop the specifications, and the state boards that currently license structural engineers have been included in this process,” Miller said.

The new 16-hour Structural exam is divided into two 8-hour components, which will be offered on successive days. The Vertical Forces component focuses on gravity loads and incidental lateral loads. The Lateral Forces component focuses on wind and earthquake loads. Each component of the exam has a breadth module that contains questions covering a comprehensive range of structural engineering topics. Each component also has a depth module that focuses more closely on a single area of practice. Examinees will choose whether they want to concentrate on buildings or bridges for this module.

To pass the exam, examinees must pass both the Vertical Forces and Lateral Forces components, but these components may be taken and passed in different exam administrations. The specifications for the new exam are available on the NCEES Web site (www.ncees.org). NCEES will also publish a book of sample questions and solutions in 2010 to familiarize examinees with the new exam’s format and content areas.

“The changeover is still two years away, but it’s an important transition,” Miller said. “We want to give people as much advance notice as possible.”

Correction ...

The disciplinary action recorded in the last *Board's Bulletin* pertaining to Mr. Richard A. Rice (Un-licensed) and Mr. Maurice L. Northcutt (Un-licensed) should have read:

Mr. Richard A. Rice, was found guilty at a formal hearing before the Board of practicing engineering in the State of Alabama without obtaining a license to practice engineering from the Board. Mr. Rice was required to pay \$627.51 to the Board as cost of the disciplinary action, and to pay a \$1,000.00 civil penalty to the State of Alabama General Fund.

Mr. Maurice L. Northcutt, was found guilty at a formal hearing before the Board of practicing engineering in the State of Alabama without obtaining a license to practice engineering from the Board. Mr. Northcutt was required to pay \$627.51 to the Board as cost of the disciplinary action, and to pay a \$1,000.00 civil penalty to the State of Alabama General Fund.

July 23-24, 2009 Board Meeting

Marcus D. Phillips, PLS 24334. On April 30, 2009 a formal hearing was held concerning the practice of land surveying by Mr. Phillips during the time his license was in suspended status. At its July 23-24, 2009 meeting the Board reviewed the documents relative to the hearing and the recommendation of the Governmental Hearing Officer and issued an order that required the revocation of Mr. Phillip's license to practice land surveying and payment of \$2,276.30 to the Board for the cost of the hearing. The case is currently under appeal.

Ted L Biddy, a non-licensed individual agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$1,500.00 civil penalty to the State of Alabama General Fund, to pay \$634.00 to the Board for the expenses incurred during the investigation, to cease and desist offering to practice or practicing engineering services in the State of Alabama until he obtains a professional engineer license from the Board and the consent order and final order would become public record.

Joseph W. Kowalski, PE 29360 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$500.00 fine to the Board, to pay \$242.00 for the cost of the investigation and the consent order and final order would become public record. Mr. Kowalski provided design drawings that contained the firm name *Kowalski Engineering* without obtaining a certificate of authorization for the firm.

John W. Parkes, PE 23782 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$2,000.00 fine to the Board, to serve a two year probationary period and the consent order and final order would become public record. Mr. Parkes placed his seal and signature on design drawings that did not meet the acceptable standards of the practice of engineering in the State of Alabama.

Donan Engineering Company agreed to a consent order that required it to pay a \$500.00 fine to the Board, to pay \$149.40 for the cost of the investigation and the consent order and final order would become public record. The firm continued to offer engineering services during the time its certificate of authorization was in lapsed status.

April 30, 2009 Board Meeting

David E. McFarren, PE 23491 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$2,000.00 fine to the Board, to serve a one year probationary period and the consent order and final order would become public record. Mr. McFarren placed his seal and signature on design drawings bearing the company name *Pyramid 1* without obtaining a certificate of authorization for the firm. The drawings signed by Mr. McFarren were within the practice of architecture.

Lee Y. Greene, Sr., PLS 10273 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$500.00 fine to the Board, to serve a six month probation period, to cease and desist placing his professional seal and signature to documents that bear the firm name Talon Engineering until such time as firm obtains a Certificate of Authorization to practice land surveying and the consent order and final order would become public record.

Kenneth E. Holt, PLS 24969 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$3,000.00 fine to the Board, to serve a one year probationary period and the consent order and final order would become public record. Mr. Holt failed to provide land surveying services in a timely manner after accepting payment for the services and failed to provide subpoenaed documents to the Board.

Building Engineering Consultants, Inc., CA- 2236-E agreed to a consent order that required the firm to pay a \$2,000.00 fine to the Board, to serve a one year probation period and the consent order and final order would become public record. The firm continued to offer engineering services during the time its certificate of authorization was in lapsed status.

YESAC Alabama Corporation, an un-certificated company, agreed to a consent order that required the firm to pay a \$1,000.00 civil penalty to the State of Alabama General Fund, to pay \$323.00 to the Board for expenses incurred during the investigation, to cease and desist offering to practice or practicing engineering services in the State of Alabama until it employs a licensed Alabama professional engineer and obtains a Certificate of Authorization and the consent order and final order would become public record.

Darrell Theophilus, a non-licensed individual agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$1,000.00 civil penalty to the State of Alabama General Fund, to pay \$262.00 to the Board for the expenses incurred during the investigation, to cease and desist offering to practice or practicing land surveying services in the State of Alabama until he obtains a professional land surveyor license from the Board and the consent order and final order would become public record.

March 5, 2009 Board Meeting

Thomas L. London, PLS 5340 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$500.00 fine to the Board, to be subject to six months probation if and when his license is returned to active status and the consent order and final order would become public record. Mr. London provided a survey that contained violations of the minimum technical standards for land surveying in the State of Alabama.

Curtis T. Pierce, PE/PLS 16175, was found guilty of charges presented at a formal hearing on December 12, 2008. After deliberation the Board accepted the recommendations of the Administrative Law Judge and issued an order which required Mr. Pierce to pay the Board a fine of \$2,500, to pay the Board \$997.75 as cost of the hearing, his license to practice land surveying was revoked and not eligible for re-issuance for one year and the Hearing Order is a public record. Mr. Pierce submitted a subdivision plat to a planning commission during the time his license to practice land surveying was suspended.

Chander P. Nangia, PE 11008 agreed to a consent order that required him to pay a \$500.00 fine to the Board, to be reprimanded for placing his professional seal and signature to design drawings that were not prepared under his direct supervision, to surrender his license to practice engineering in the State of Alabama and not to seek re-issuance of the license for two years from the date of surrender and the consent order and final order would become public record. Mr. Nangia placed his professional seal and signature to design drawings that were not prepared under his direct supervision and surrendered his license to practice engineering in the State of Alaska during a complaint investigation.
